A few words from our Principal Mr Stuart Nicholson

Looking back...

Whilst there is no doubt that the coronavirus has turned most normal routines upside down, we have been able to retain a remarkable level of continuity for students at Bishopstrow College. As we prepare for a return to the physical premises on campus at the end of September, it is interesting to look back on the remarkable different six months that we have just experienced. At our very last meeting on campus in March, we promised the students who were there that we would be continuing everything we possibly could about Bishopstrow in the online world. We promised assemblies, the same teachers, that they'd be able to talk to their teachers and their friends, and that we would even find a way of continuing with the sports, games and exercise that we also regard as an integral part of the education here.



Six months later, all of these things have happened. It has been such a great joy to see our students continuing to engage both with their teachers and their fellow students, and clearly to enjoy so much the opportunities to learn, and to enjoy learning.

Looking forward...

Gazing into the crystal ball, there remains a lot of uncertainty about how coronavirus will affect the long-term for many aspects of normal life, but in the short-term everyone at Bishopstrow is now well prepared for managing the requirements of social distancing, careful hygiene, and everything that contributes to the "new normal" for schools. Much of this preparation we have been making since before lockdown took place at the end of March, as we were initially looking at what needed to be done to keep students safe when it looked like everyone would be locked into the College rather than locked out of it!

What was clear then remains a huge advantage to us now, which is that Bishopstrow is a full boarding school without any day students at all. This means that we can provide a very Covid-secure setting for all our students, with the minimum chance of transmission of the virus into the school.

We are taking the most careful approach to quarantine, to support both quarantined and non-quarantined students, with risk profiling, testing, and a rigorous approach to hygiene, so that we can do our very best to reduce the likelihood of coronavirus disturbing the educational routines that support Bishopstrow students so well.

We have taken advice from the national and local health authorities, and I have taken advantage of having personal contacts in virology laboratories in Cambridge to seek their advice and make sure that the things that we are doing are the most sensible and practical steps that can be taken.

Inevitably parents are going to be nervous because there is uncertainty around quarantine regulations, but what seems clear is that there are very few places that are going to be Covid-secure as a full boarding school in the UK that is taking careful measures to take advantage of its 100% boarding status. Bishopstrow is doing just that, and parents can be fully confident that in choosing Bishopstrow they are making as good a choice for their children's health and welfare as they are for their educational welfare.


Exam Success

This year, our students have been rewarded with the best grades in the College's history, despite facing the most unusual situation for external examinations that we have ever known!

Across the country we suspect there was an initial sense of relief and elation when students discovered that they were not going to have to sit examinations for IGCSE, or A Level and other qualifications this summer.

The work that has taken place behind the scenes by everyone who taught examination candidates this year has been enormous. Every year teachers are required to forecast students' grades, but this year the process of checking, moderating and justifying these decisions assumed a far higher significance. We are hugely grateful to the teachers for doing such a thorough job and we have no doubt that the students will also want to express the same appreciation to their teachers.

All of the Bishopstrow students who take the IGCSE examinations complete the two-year course in just one year, and they are studying in their second language. It is always a huge achievement to pass any IGCSE examination in such circumstances.



This year, not only was every examination completed successfully, but we had a significant proportion of results that were not just passing grades, but the very top grades. What a tremendous success for both our students and our teachers!

A Special Mention


We would also like to give a special mention to these students who have had a particularly good Term 4 academically in Mathematics:

- KIND Looking after and supporting others



Sport Online

In Term 4, the online sports programme at Bishopstrow focused on five major sports: Rounders, Athletics, Tennis, Cricket and Hockey. These are normally offered as practical activities at Bishopstrow College in the knowledge that they are traditional sports that students will pursue when moving on to their destination school.



Throughout the term the students were introduced to the major sports via a collection of video clips which explained the basic principles, rules and techniques of each sport. They were then required to submit answers to written questions about each particular sport.

Interestingly, some students conveyed to tutorial staff, through their exercise diaries, that they had been inspired to play more sport with their friends after watching the video clips during their PSHE lessons.

The staff then set quiz competitions throughout the term for students to test their knowledge of the sports they had learnt and Stars were awarded to those students who made the best contributions.

In addition to these sports, students were encouraged to exercise every day and complete a Weekly Exercise Diary, for discussion with their tutors.

We are aware that our returning students in September are all looking forward to engaging in real sporting activity, as indeed are our sports staff!

Pastoral Support Online

PSHE classes have taken place each teaching day. During these lessons, the students were encouraged to watch the daily assembly and to make notes for their assembly diaries for completion each week. Once the assembly had been watched, they did the sports tasks for the week. In the later part of the PSHE lesson, the students were expected to complete outstanding homework assignments.

The assembly themes for the term were:

- 5 Virtues
- Internet Safety
- Drugs and Alcohol
- Relationships and Bullying
- Human Rights

These were discussed with students, guided by the Tutor and followed up by each student's individual tutor.

The PSHE tutor monitored the students' diaries during the PSHE classes and this was reinforced during the students' tutorials. Feedback from subject teachers, PSHE tutors and personal tutors regarding student levels of engagement in class, their commitment to homework assignments, attendance and punctuality and general well-being, were discussed on a daily basis at the end of each academic day. Personal Tutorials proved to be invaluable in allowing students the opportunity to talk freely about any anxieties they had.

Global Warming Project

This term students were asked to design and develop a campaign to warn people of the possible effects of Global Warming. During two lessons students were focused on the causes and consequences of Global Warming as part of the human aspect of Geography.

Destination Schools 2019/20

Throughout the academic year, students secured places at over 70 boarding schools in the UK, with all students gaining entry to their first choice 'destination school'. Bishopstrow's independence enables us to support our students with examination preparation and interview techniques for any mainstream boarding school and we are delighted with the success of our students here. Our students have enjoyed some of the best online provision in the world in their face-to-face online classes over the last six months. Students joining us virtually will be able to meet with students who are on campus and studying in our 'physical' classrooms. They will also be able to meet with students who are temporarily quarantined, as they will be working online from their bedrooms at Bishopstrow for the 14-day quarantine period, rather than from the classrooms.

Not surprisingly, we have all learned new skills during lockdown and we are going to carry forward some of those new skills and do some things differently on campus next term. We are going to take advantage of some of the possibilities offered by Microsoft Teams and continue using some of the technology that has become a routine part of our virtual classrooms, in the physical classroom.
