Bishopstrow College is delighted to announce that students graduating from the College in the academic year through to August 2015 have again secured places at a number of leading independent prep and senior schools, continuing on the successes of previous graduating classes.

During the 2014/15 academic year, 121 students graduated from the College, broadly spread across the College's three main programmes – Lower College (ages 7-11), Middle College (ages 12-13) and Upper College (ages 14-17).
