End of Term Graduation



On June 7, 2018, we were delighted to welcome Stephen llett, Headmaster of Port Regis School as Guest Speaker at the College's End of Term 3 Graduation Ceremony.

On a sunny June afternoon, we celebrated the success of those students who had completed their programme of study at Bishopstrow. College staff and students were joined by agents and parents. We were also delighted to welcome a number of representatives from Bishopstrow's Partner Schools, including Downside, Kingswood, Mill Hill School, Monkton Combe School, Oundle, King Edward's School Witley and Wycliffe College.

Whilst the success of all students was celebrated, particular attention was made to the 50+ students graduating from the College. Most of the leavers are continuing their studies at a leading boarding school or college in the UK, including Ampleforth College, Concord College, Earlscliffe, Godstowe, King's Junior School Canterbury, LVS Ascot, Marlborough College, Mill Hill International and Prior Park College.

Students Celebrate Exam Success

We are delighted to report another excellent set of IGCSE examination results. Overall, students enrolled on both the 1 Year IGCSE Programme and Senior College Programme performed well, with 96% of grades for this cohort between A* to C (up on 90% in 2017 and the strongest set of A* to C passes the College has ever attained). Separately, 41% of grades were either A* or A.

In addition to securing excellent examination results, students on the 1 Year IGCSE Programme (who sat IGCSEs in up to 8 subjects) secured entry to some of the UK's best boarding schools, including King's School Canterbury, Marlborough College, Prior Park College, St Edward's School, Oxford, plus Institut Montana in Switzerland.

Commenting on the results, Lorraine Atkins, Principal said: "I am delighted that our students have achieved such terrific results. Their hard work and determination has been exemplary and the results are particularly outstanding as they are studying in a second language."

We would like to congratulate all students on their examination results and wish them well as they continue their studies in the sixth form at boarding schools and colleges across the UK. Our congratulations also go to those students who sat Cambridge English Language Assessment examinations in 2018. The cohort maintained the College's excellent record of results with 100% of students achieving a passing grade, and 86% of students being awarded a Merit or Distinction.

Susanna's previous experience includes more than 5 years as a Houseparent and EFL Teacher at Abbots Bromley School and Bolitho School. New Teaching Partnerships Announced

We are pleased to confirm that we continue to establish Teaching Partnerships with leading boarding schools in the UK. In the past few months, UKVI has approved Teaching Partnerships with Ashville College, Haberdashers' Monmouth Schools, Lancing College and Sidcot School.

The College now maintains Teaching Partnerships validated by UKVI, with c.90 schools. Under these Teaching Partnerships, students with a confirmed offer of a place at a partner school can attend a pre-sessional programme at Bishopstrow College, where the partner school issues the CAS and Tier 4 visa, covering the period of study at Bishopstrow.
